The essay contest provides students an opportunity to learn more about the Labor Movement's involvement in the social and economic development of our country. **The contest is only open to Pennsylvania AFL-CIO affiliated union members and their families. All submissions must be postmarked by January 31, 2018.**

Awards are offered to students in 2 categories: Graduating High School Seniors (class of 2018) and All Post-Secondary Students. The award amounts are: First Place - \$2,500, Second Place - \$1,500, Third Place - \$1,000.

The essay topics for each category are as follows:

Category I – Graduating High School Seniors:

"How do politics and legislation impact the ability to organize unions?"

Category II – Students Attending an Accredited, Post-Secondary Institution:

"How do Supreme Court decisions and State right-to-work laws affect the future of unionism?"

HOW CAN YOU APPLY?

To apply, you must write a minimum 1,500-word essay on the topic in your respective category. (Essays with fewer than 1,500 words will be disqualified).

- Essays must be typed and neatly prepared.
- Titles must be kept as they appear on brochure.
- Entries must be formatted as a PDF file and e-mailed to president@paflcio.org
- Your application form must be included in essay PDF file or attached to e-mail as a separate PDF.
- Entries must be e-mailed by January 31, 2018.
